
Catching up with KC

CDL Driving Track races ahead



Kilgore College officially broke ground for its new CDL Driver Training Track to begin construction of a large driving track, classroom facility and warehouse training building as part of a major expansion of the KC Transportation Institute. The new track, located at 4931 FM 349 in Kilgore – next to the Texas Department of Public Safety Commercial Driver's License Testing Office, is a collaborative partnership with the Kilgore Economic Development Corporation, and the City of Kilgore in the design and approval process of the project that will be constructed by RLM General Contractors.
